

Metroquest Highlights:

- February 1 February 18, 2022
- 267 total participants
- 73% are residents of the area
- 99% travel this area by personal vehicle, 11% would prefer to bike
- 74% of participants were white
- 57% of participants identified as male
- 44% of participants were between 25-54 years old











Overview: This image shows three potential locations for a Park and Ride lot as suggested by City and County stakeholders

- Average score: 61% Yes / 39% No
- Comments: A few commenters expressed overcrowding concerns in the parking lots.












State Farm Building Parking Lot: This potential location for a park and ride lot would utilize the existing parking lot of the State Farm Building located on the State Farm Boulevard.

- Average score: 53% Yes / 47% No
- Comments: A few commenters expressed concerns of additional congestion in the area.












US 250, across from Peter Jefferson Parkway: This potential location for a park and ride lot would utilize the vacant parcel on the north side of US 250, across from Peter Jefferson Parkway.

- Average score: 44% Yes / 56% No
- Comments: A few commenters expressed concerns of additional congestion in the area.












South of Interstate 64: This potential location for a park and ride lot would utilize the vacant parcel on the southwest side of US 250, behind the existing commercial buildings.

- Average score: 46% Yes / 54% No
- Comments: A few commenters expressed concerns of additional congestion in the area.











No Improvement: Leave the existing configuration as-is but extend the existing merge lane from southbound Route 22 to westbound US 250

- Average score: 2.96
- Comments: Most of the commenters expressed they would like clarification on the operations of the current configuration.

US 250 & ROUTE 22 (LOUISA ROAD)











Displaced Left-turn: This alternative will reconstruct the west leg of the intersection as a displaced left-turn which will improve safety and decrease congestion.

- Average score: 2.45
- Comments: Some of the commenters expressed concerns of confusion for motorists utilizing the recommendation.

US 250 & ROUTE 22 (LOUISA ROAD)











No Improvement: Leave the existing conditions as is; no improvements.

- Average score: 2.57
- Comments: Some of the commenters expressed the intersection currently does not operate well.

US 250 & Route 729











Roundabout: This alternative reconfigures the intersection to a roundabout with a right-turn lane for vehicles turning right onto SB N Milton Road from EB US 250. Roundabouts improve operations and safety.

- Average score: 3.53
- Comments: Some of the commenters expressed negative concerns towards this recommendation.
